

2025 Arkansas Labor Market Report January



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January

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The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared

monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous month's data is subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2024 benchmark.

Explanation of Terms and Concepts

Monthly Business

Survey of Employers

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry information on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bu-reau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, fullor part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th of the month. Approximately

Metropolitan

Statistical Areas

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

Current Population

Survey (CPS)

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 1,200 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

Civilian Labor Force

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

Employment

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

Unemployment

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

<u>Unemployment</u>

Rate

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates are calculated from unrounded data.

<u>Seasonal</u>

<u>Adjustment</u>

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, schedule shifts, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.

January Spotlight

Annual Data Revisions

Civilian Labor Force:

In accordance with guidelines from the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Arkansas' Civilian Labor Force (CLF) estimates have undergone annual processing. The purpose of annual processing is to incorporate more complete and accurate information into the estimation process, including updated population data from the US Census Bureau. In addition to these geographic changes, the 2024 annual processing cycle incorporated synthetic intercensal population controls for model-based areas and updated American Community Survey and decennial census inputs into substate estimation.

Each decade, new federal statistical area delineations are issued by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) following the decennial census. Arkansas had geographic changes impacting 3 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs):

- Pine Bluff MSA (consisting of Cleveland, Jefferson, and Lincoln counties) no longer meets the population threshold for an MSA and the series has been discontinued
- Fayetteville-Springdale-Rogers MSA (consisting of Benton, Madison, and Washington counties in Arkansas and McDonald County in Missouri) will no longer include McDonald County in Missouri
- Fort Smith MSA (consisting of Crawford and Sebastian counties in Arkansas and LeFlore and Seguoyah counties in Oklahoma) will no longer include LeFlore County in Oklahoma

All levels of data—State, counties, Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs), Micropolitan Statistical Areas, Local Workforce Development Areas, and cities—have been revised. The Statewide CLF data was revised back to January 1976 and sub-state CLF data for was revised back to January 1990. Revised data can be found on our Discover Arkansas website or at www.bls.gov. Nonfarm Payroll Jobs:

In accordance with the same guidelines, the Current Employment Statistics program also reestimated the Nonfarm Payroll Job series to include more comprehensive and precise information into the calculations. Statewide estimates were revised back to April 2023. The same OMB standards for Metropolitan Statistical Areas applies to both CLF data and Nonfarm Payroll Job data. MSA revisions are as follows:

- Pine Bluff MSA has been discontinued
- Fayetteville-Springdale-Rogers MSA is revised back to January 1990
- Fort Smith MSA is revised back to January 1990
- All other MSAs without geographical changes were revised back to April 2023

Civilian Labor Force Summary

The Arkansas Division of Workforce Services, Workforce Policy and Innovation, in conjunction with the Bureau of Labor Statistics, announced Arkansas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained stable at 3.6% between December 2024 and January 2025. The unemployment rate for December 2024 was originally estimated at 3.4% but was later revised up to 3.6%. The United States' jobless rate declined one-tenth of a percentage point, from 4.1% in December 2024 to 4.0% in January 2025.


Arkansas' civilian labor force rose 2,068 in January, due largely to the addition of 1,956 more employed Arkansans. This marks the 36th consecutive month of record high employment. Arkansas' labor force participation rate continues upward growth, reaching 58.4% in January.

Compared to January 2024, there are 19,791 more employed in the State. The unemployment rate is up two-tenths of a percentage point, while the labor force participation rate is up four-tenths of a percentage point over-the-year.




Monthly Job Gains/Losses by Major Industry Sector











County Labor Force Summary


Between December 2024 and January 2025, unemployment rates increased in 74 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Izard County remained stable over the month. Jobless rates ranged from a low of 3.0% in Benton County to a high of 7.5% in Desha County.

In January, only Benton County posted an unemployment rate at or below 3%. That is down from 10 counties at or below three percent in December. One county reported a jobless rate at or above seven percent, compared to no county above seven percent last month.

Compared to January 2024, unemployment rates are up in 37 Arkansas counties. Jobless rates were down in 25 counties, while remaining stable in 13 counties. Over the year changes ranged from an increase of one and seven-tenths of a percentage point in Monroe County, to a drop of eight-tenths of a percentage point in Clay County.
